Harold Cazneaux (30 March 1878 – 19 June 1953) was an Australian pictorialist photographer; a pioneer whose style had an indelible impact on the development of Australian photographic history. In 1916, he was a founder of the Pictorialist Sydney Camera Circle. As a regular participator in national and international exhibitions, Cazneaux was unfaltering in his desire to contribute to the discussion about the photography of his times. He created some of the most memorable images of the early twentieth century.



I recently picked up a 1900 German made Adelaide Town Hall postcard dated 16th May 1900 from a series produced for the German Market to advertise and commits South Autorida.

Efectures Adelaide Town Holl and Aldridges Plince Alfred Hotel, c1890 from original album print (gloss plate) by sweet, 5 x 7 inches.

Adekade Town Holl Is a landmark building in King William Sheet, Adekade, South Australia, The structure was designed by Edmund Wright and Edward Woods with comtruction commencing in 1863 asnot completed in 1864.



The Tower's named after Prince Albert and the Clock was installed in 1935. George Aldridge died on 12th December 1879 at his residence Prince Albed Hotel, King William Street in his 63th year.
