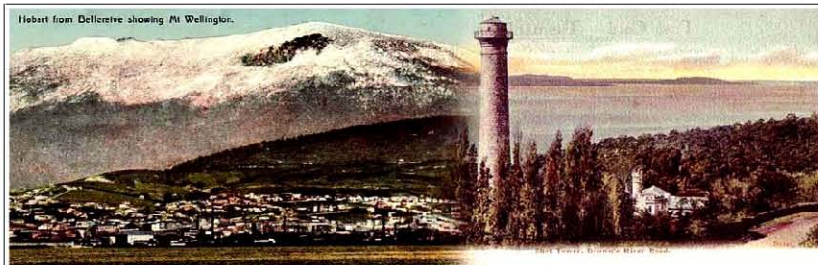

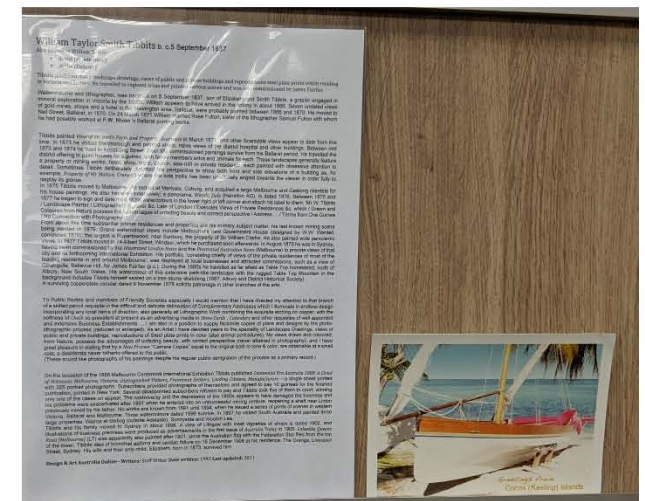

# President's Report

## AUSTRALIAN POSTCARD SOCIETY PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2020/21

Adelaide was in lock down at the time of our planned AGM (22/7) so was deferred until August. However, it is pleasing to report that the Australian Postcard Society has been able to meet in SAPHIL House for the whole year under review, having held its first meeting on Thursday 25 June last year following the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions in Step 2 of the State's Plan.

A COVID-Safe Plan was prepared for SAPHIL House on 2 June 2020 following the announcement of Step 2 restrictions. This allowed for up to 20 persons in the Main Hall, enough for an APS Meeting. On 19 June 2020, the SA Government removed the restriction of 20 persons, basing the maximum on 4sqm per person which took us to Step 2 Plus, allowing 23 persons. Then on 27 June 2020, the 4sqm per person was relaxed to 2sqm in Step 3 which allowed for up to 46 persons in the Main Hall. This was further relaxed to 69 persons on 31 March 2021, then back to 46 again on 29 June 2021, back up to 69 on 5 July 2021, then back down to 46 again on 16 July. It is bound to change again at some point after the current lock down ends. Club attendances are such that even at 23 we can still hold our meetings.

Several major events have occurred for the Club in the last year. Firstly, the Joint Exhibition with the Australian Match Cover Collectors Society (deferred from 2020) finally went ahead on 1 & 2 May 2021 at the Drill Hall. This was very successful however, due to the high cost of hiring the Drill Hall, we made an overall loss of \$308.13 (shared 50/50 between the two Clubs) however our Open Day at SAPHIL House on 16 May made \$510.50 so overall the Club was in front by \$356.44. A pleasing result for all the effort involved.

We also hosted Congress in 2020 at SAPHIL House as the Drill Hall was going to be cost prohibitive for one Club. There were two dealers in attendance with displays on the main hall boards and in the car bay area. This was also successful with a surplus of \$463.85 being made, this time shared 50/50 with the SACP.
